One of the main concerns we are hearing from passengers is the absence of a grocery store in Richwood. Citizens must travel to Craigsville or Summersville to do their grocery shopping.

Traveling to get groceries can be burdensome to an individual with no car or no neighbor to ask for a ride. Unfortunately, this is a troubling reality to the citizens of Richwood.

MTA currently offers a route from Richwood to Summersville twice a day Monday through Friday. This route accommodates many people but we think that by adding an additional route on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Fridays of every month, many more individuals can be helped.

This route has been specifically designed for those who need to grocery shop. We are asking that individuals please call the office to schedule their pick-up.

The bus will arrive in Rich-

wood at 9:30am to pick up scheduled passengers and will leave the bus stop at 10:00am traveling to Summersville along Rt. 39.

The return trip to Richwood will leave at 1:00pm. Which will allow for approximately 2 hours of shopping.

After running ads, posting flyers and sharing on Facebook, we have received a reasonable amount of response regarding the grocery run. It is our hope that not only will the route be successful, but we help as many people as possible.

Replacement Vehicles

MTA has received two replacement vehicles from the WV Division of Public Transit-a Dodge minivan that will be used for Non-emergency Medical Transportation and an 18 passenger Ford E-450 bus.

MTA submits a 5-year plan with each Section 5311 grant application. This plan projects what capital assets will need to be replaced. The WV Division of Public Transit procures replacement vehicles as needed for transit systems throughout West Virginia.

Because MTA received two new replacement vehiclse, the WV Division of Public Transit was able to supply two of MTA's older buses to Weirton Transit Corporation. Thev provide transportation in Brooke and Hancock counties and were experiencing a vehicle shortage this year.
